
Average Daily Accessions














Marital Status in Context






NAD: Average Congregation Size – (2000-2011)






Christian Denominations Worldwide Ranked by Number of Adherents 2008







Religious **Composition** Of **Immigrants** In Canada, by Decade of Arrival




















Membership: Top 10 Countries -- (2012)




Giving: Top 10 Unions (Tithe) -- (2011)



Giving: Top 10 Unions (Tithe per Capita) -- (2011)






