





#### Role of PSI


- Guide NAD constituent institutions in achieving sustainable financial support

Albert Schweitzer said, "One thing I know: The only ones among you who will be really happy are those who will have sought and found how to serve."




# Bases for fundraising at NAD constituent organizations

- Fundraising is biblical.
- Generosity is mutually beneficial.

- Avoid the proverbial "cart before the horse"—focus on money when we should focus on the benefits of giving and on the cause.
- Fundraising raises up an institution—we have to take a good look at ourselves because the better the organization, the better the results.
- It's not about the money—it's about a good cause that has a price tag.
- It's the good causes that engage us as PSI staff, which provides mutual satisfaction for making a difference.


## Examples of NAD organizations and their fundraising—Rationale for PSI's existence
